

Urgel "Bob" Boulanger CD Sep 1942 – Dec 2002



Urgel "Bob" Boulanger, 79, passed away peacefully weeks short of his 80th birthday. His final hours were spent surrounded by family, sharing stories, and listening to favourite tunes.

Born on September 20, 1942, in Sainte-Angèle-de-Prémont, Québec, he was the son of Lucie (Lacoursiere) age 101 and late Urgel Boulanger – who tragically passed away before the birth of Urgel.

Bob joined the Royal Canadian Air Force at age 17, his time in the military gave him a life full of travel and a particular fondness for good beer and schnitzel. He began his career in Clinton, ON, before moving to Summerside, PEI 1961, where he met and later married his beloved wife Yvette (née Richard).

Throughout his long career, he served overseas in Marville, France, and Lahr, Germany, before returning to Canada and being stationed in Bagotville, QC, and St-Hubert, ON. He retired in Ottawa in 1996 after 36 years of service in the RCAF.

Moving to Moncton, Bob worked as a Commissionaire with the Codiac Region RCMP for 12 years. Over the years, he continued to serve the community by taking on leadership roles with the Dieppe Military Veterans' Association (Second Vice President) and the Golden Age Club of Dieppe (President).

He will be remembered for his humour, his tenacity, and his charm. He was funny, loyal, and stubborn as hell. He will be dearly missed by all who knew him.
